Councilor Walker offered a motion to authorize the purchase of equipment for repair, maintenance and updating of the Splash Pad, in the amount of \$3,202.94. Councilor Kirkland

duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. Mayor Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously".

Councilor Walker offered a motion to provide support to Clastran, in the amount of \$1,500.00. Councilor Sanders duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for a roll call vote with the following results: Councilor Irvin-yes; Councilor Walker-yes; Councilor Sanders-yes; Councilor Churchwell-yes; Councilor Kirkland-yes; Mayor Roberts-yes.
