

Council Minutes
February 6, 2025
Regular Meeting

The Pinson City Council met in regular session at Pinson City Hall at 4410 Main Street, Pinson, on Thursday, February 6, 2025, Councilor Roberts led the invocation. Councilor Walker led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Minutes: Councilor Sanders offered a motion to waive the reading of and approve the minutes from January 16, 2025. Councilor Walker duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Mayor Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously".**

Finance: Councilor Irvin offered a motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$93,882.07. Councilor Walker duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Mayor Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously".**

Annexation: Councilor Churchwell offered an ordinance of annexation for 3917 Mars Avenue. Councilor Sanders duly seconded the motion. Old Business: Mayor Roberts asked for reports regarding the demolition of 4302/4306 Main Street. Marie Turner, City Clerk, gave the report stating the property located at 4302/ 4306 Main Street has been demolished as directed by council in Resolution 24-07. The clerk gave notice of

the demolition cost in the amount of \$7,029.32 and stated a public hearing of the council will be held at the February 20, 2025 meeting at 7:00pm to consider the report of costs.

Council Sanders offered a motion to accept the slightly amended contract with the Jefferson County Sheriff's Department. Councilor Irvin duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for a roll call vote with the following results: Councilor Irvin- yes, Councilor Walker- yes, Councilor Sanders-yes, Councilor Churchwell- yes, Mayor Roberts- yes. **Mayor Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously".**

New Business:

Mayor Roberts offered a First Reading of the Business License ordinance amendment regarding Temporary License.

Mayor Roberts gave a First Reading regarding mayor and council salaries for those duly elected in the August 2025 general municipal election. Mayor Roberts explained the purpose for these Ordinances, and Attorney Black stated that the Law indicates the last day council can make changes to the salaries in 6 months prior to the election which would be February 26.

Department Head Reports:

Hal Ferris Building official gave a report on the Grand opening of Aldi and Dominos Pizza Building and Remodel. Mr. Ferris also stated new houses are being built in the Innsbrooke Community and a lot more remodels are being done in the city.

Public Comment:

Deputy Chief Tinney, CenterPoint Fire Department, gave the Fire District Report. He also thanked Chief Taylor Hancock, Palmerdale Fire District, for his help and coordination during the winter weather. Deputy Chief Tinne thanked mayor and council for the Gentech laptops for Fire District vehicles. Feb. 24 will begin the recruit program at CenterPoint Fire Department Training Facility.

Councilor Walker offered a motion to enter executive session to discuss real estate, trade and commerce, and litigation. Councilor Irvin duly seconded the motion.
