

Council Minutes
May 22, 2025
Regular Meeting

The Pinson City Council met in regular session at Pinson City Hall at 4410 Main Street, Pinson, on Thursday, May 22, 2025, Mayor Roberts led the invocation. Councilor Sanders led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Minutes: Councilor Kirkland offered a motion to waive the reading of and approve the minutes from May 1, 2025. Councilor Sanders duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Mayor Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously"**.

Finance: Councilor Irvin offered a motion to approve the bills in the amount of \$355,983.45. Councilor Kirkland duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say 'aye', all opposed say 'no'. **Mayor Roberts, "Let the record reflect the 'ayes' carry unanimously"**.

Mayor Reports: Mayor Roberts announced the Splash pad will open, May 24, 2025, and will be open each week, Tuesday – Sunday, throughout the summer.

Mayor Roberts reported the open position for a Park and Rec Director is now pending with a potential candidate.

Mayor Roberts and council reported on their attendance at the Alabama League of Municipalities Convention. Mayor Roberts stated Councilor John Churchwell received recognition for his 20 years of service.

Mayor Roberts reported on the event he attended recognizing Leslie Chatta, Teacher of the Year.

New Business: Councilor Sanders offered a resolution adopting transportation action plan, regarding Rebuild Alabama Act. Councilor Churchwell duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for unanimous consent to consider with the following results: Councilor Irvin-yes; Councilor Sanders-yes; Councilor Churchwell-yes; Councilor Kirkland-yes; Mayor Roberts-yes. Mayor Roberts, "unanimous consent passes". Mayor Roberts called for a roll call vote with the

following results: Councilor Irvin-yes; Councilor Sanders-yes; Councilor Churchwell-yes; Councilor Kirkland-yes; Mayor Roberts-yes. **Mayor Roberts, “Let the record reflect the resolution passes unanimously as, Resolution 25-11”.**

Councilor Sanders offered a motion to approve a grant request to BREMSS, in the amount of \$1,341.27. Councilor Irvin duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say ‘aye’, all opposed say ‘no’. **Mayor Roberts, “Let the record reflect the ‘ayes’ carry unanimously”.**

Councilor Kirkland offered a motion to approve a change order from M & M Mobile Truck services in the amount of \$14,000.00, for clearing the ditch beside Palmerdale Fire Station on Miles Spring Road. Councilor Sanders duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts stated we will use funds allocated to Palmerdale Fire District for 50% of the amount. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say ‘aye’, all opposed say ‘no’. **Mayor Roberts, “Let the record reflect the ‘ayes’ carry unanimously”.**

Councilor Irvin offered an ordinance to set qualification fee for the 2025 municipal election, \$50.00 Mayor; \$30.00 Councilmember. Councilor Kirkland duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for unanimous consent to consider with the following results: Councilor Irvin-yes; Councilor Sanders-yes; Councilor Churchwell-yes; Councilor Kirkland-yes; Mayor Roberts-yes. Mayor Roberts, “unanimous consent passes”. Mayor Roberts called for a roll call vote with the following results: Councilor Irvin-yes; Councilor Sanders-yes; Councilor Churchwell-yes; Councilor Kirkland-yes; Mayor Roberts-yes. **Mayor Roberts, “Let the record reflect the ordinance passes unanimously as, Ordinance 2025-11”.**

Councilor Churchwell offered a motion to approve a request from PVHS Band and Mariachi, in the amount of \$12,000.00. Councilor Kirkland duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say ‘aye’, all opposed say ‘no’. **Mayor Roberts, “Let the record reflect the ‘ayes’ carry unanimously”.**

Councilor Irvin offered a motion to approve a request for Professional Development regarding PVHS FBLA teacher, the amount of \$1,000.00, with the stipulation that if she does not return to PVHS for the upcoming school year she will be required to repay the approve funds. Councilor Sanders duly seconded the motion. Mayor Roberts called for all in favor say ‘aye’, all opposed say ‘no’. **Mayor Roberts, “Let the record reflect the ‘ayes’ carry unanimously”.**
